Day 1 : Arrival



Evening arrival at Anchorage International Airport. Collect your bags and pick up your rental car at the airport. Stay in a very comfortable and unusual Bed & Breakfast in Anchorage, just minutes from the airport.

Day 2 Travel to Kenai Peninsula



1st Class Lodging at Bear Paw Adventure Wise Old Hunter: \$270/night for 4 Moose Cabin: \$160/night for 2. Additional Guests \$30 each. A \$35 cleaning fee is waived for stays > 3 nights

Enjoy a great breakfast at the B&B (included in the price) and get away early as there will be lots of things to see this day. Take the Seward Hwy south from Anchorage and then the Sterling Hwy to Anchor Point (about a 200 mile drive). Enjoy a stroll on an elevated boardwalk and see a variety of birds and small mammals; look for sheep on the side of the road; enjoy and photograph great scenery along the water and over the mountains; drive through the tunnel and visit Whittier; see and photograph moose, black bear, grizzly bear, caribou, musk ox, forest buffalo, coyotes, eagles and more; have a great lunch at Summit Lake; visit an educational interpretive Native American site. You may want to purchase groceries at the Fred Meyer store in Soldotna. Arrive at Bear Paw Adventure in the evening where you can prepare supper - or eat out.

Day 3: On the Saltwater



If fishing is included in your plans: Enjoy a six to eight-hour guided halibut & salmon charter on Cook Inlet. There will be a maximum of 6 fisherman on board and all the fishing gear is provided. Bring your personal gear, water & a snack if you want. Your fish will be cleaned for you free and services are available to process and freeze the fillets at an additional cost of about \$1.05/lb.

If fishing is not your interest: Full day guided hiking (3-4 hrs) and kayaking (2-3 hrs) on a glacier lake. Dress comfortably and bring layers and rain gear as it will likely be cool and breezy at the glacier. Bring your lunch and water.

Day 4: Explore the Anchor Point Area



Here are some of the things you might do today at Anchor Point and nearby.

Start out the day with a good breakfast that you can prepare in your kitchen - or eat out at one of the local restaurants. Photograph an old Russian church; visit a well know art studio; hike on the beach or on a local trail; have lunch at the Russian Village; photograph Mt. Iliamna and Mt. Redoubt from the Anchor River park areas; relax and watch for eagles and moose as you grill your supper on the Lodge or Moose Cabin gas grille decks. Or, fish the Anchor River this day.

All of these activities are free, except for meals & your spending at gift shops. There is also a \$10 parking fee at the Anchor River Parks.

Day 5: In the Air & on the Water for Bears & Fish



Board a float plane and fly across Cook Inlet where you will land on a small lake. At that point you will transfer to a small boat where you will view brown or black bear with your professional guide. You'll have great views of the Alaska Range, Mt. Redoubt, Mt. Spur and Mt. Iliamna from the air. And, you can also fish for salmon on this trip.

Day 6: Explore the Homer Area



Here are a few things to do in Homer, which is about 15 miles from Anchor Point.

Visit the museum, art galleries, marine center, and gift shops in Homer. Have lunch in Homer or on the Homer Spit; visit the Salty Dog Saloon and gift shops on the spit. Check the great view of the Kachemak Bay from the hill over Homer. You can also fish the fishing hole on the Homer Spit this day.

Day 7: Marine Tour - Whale watching!



Six-hr marine tour on the Kenai Fjords (whales, sea birds, sea otters, glaciers, etc) & tour of Seal Life Center. Includes a great sight seeing drive to Seward. This will be a long but very enjoyable day.

Day 8: Travel to Anchorage for your return flight

Visit the Kenai Visitors & Culture Center museum & wildlife displays; Bird watchers - stop at the Kenai River Flats Recreation Site, visit Old Town Kenai and the city dock, visit the Captain Cook State Recreational Area north of Nikiski.
